

It is necessary to know their educational needs and to find how to work with them.

Payments:

- Payments must include both items (Project management and implementation and Transnational project meetings).
- Payments are not related only to one item.
- We want to distribute payments evenly throughout all the duration of the project.
- Payments may not be for the whole grant before we pass the final evaluation, because we will not receive the whole grant after passing this evaluation







Article 6 - Payments

- The Contractor commits itself to carrying out payments, less any expenditure incurred on behalf of the Partner, relating to the subject matter of this contract to the Partner according to the achievement of the tasks and according to the following schedule:
- **First Payment:** Every partner will receive a first payment of 1.000€ as soon as the money is delivered by the Spanish National Agency (SEPIE) to the coordinator of the project.
- Intermediate Payments: After that, before every meeting takes place –normally about two months before the event-, the host shall receive 1.500€, and each one of the guests shall receive 1.000€. It is important to realize that the coordinator will have to receive in due diligence all necessary work and financial reports, and agree to them, before each of the payments is released to the hosts.
- **Final payment:** It will be paid once partner's tasks have been completed, outputs from the work plan accomplished and the financial report approved in electronic and paper version, and once Final Report and the quality of the outputs have been approved by the National Agency.
- All payments shall be regarded as advances pending explicit approval of the final, the corresponding cost statement and the quality of the results of the project report by the National Agency.
- 3. Any revenue generated by the project and received by the Partner shall be declared in the financial statement and shall limit the Erasmus+ financial contribution to the amount required to balance revenue and expenditure. Any revenue shall be declared and communicated to the Contractor in order for the Contractor to be able to fill out the Interim and Final Reports for the Agreement 2019-1-ES01-KA202-065847 concluded with the National Agency.



For a good evaluation of the project, it is very important that its execution and its impact and dissemination are adequate. These items become more important than the others.







Also the quality evaluation is very important because, the final grant depends on this evaluation (Annex III. IV):

A reduction in the cost of the eligible expenses may be applied because of deficient, partial or late execution which may be:

- · 25% if the final report gets between 40 and 49 points;
- 50% if the final report gets between 25 and 39 points;
- 75% if the final report gets less than 25 points.
